Student Conduct during Examinations

1. Each examination candidate must be prepared to produce, upon the request of the invigilator or examiner, his or her UBCcard for identification.

$$f(x, y) = x^3 + y^3 - 12xy,$$

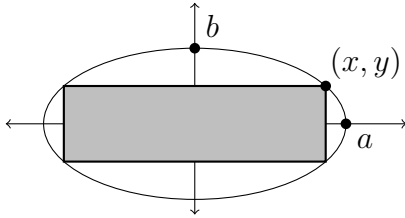
and classify each critical point as a local maximum, a local minimum, or a saddle point.
